



Marion County 4-H DRESS CODE

For Males and Females



The dress code is designed to assure that each 4-H member brings the appropriate attire resembling a school and community expectation. Any youth attending 4-H events or showing at the South Eastern Youth Fair are expected to adhere to standards of dress and appearance that are compatible with an effective learning environment.

The objective of the 4-H Dress Code is to:

1. Promote a positive image of 4-H by using a consistent, identifiable appearance. The public will recognize a group dressed in similar fashion and;
2. Eliminate any real or perceived advantage or disadvantage in an activity caused by appearance.

4-H members will wear:

Pants can be: Green, black, or khaki. No blue jeans, or pants with tears or visible stains will be accepted.

Shirts are to be white, long sleeve, collared, and button down with 4-H insignia (front left side); the 4-H jacket is optional.



The emblem can be sewn, silk-screened, fused or securely fastened using Velcro type fastener or spray adhesive. Visible pins (safety, stick and straight) are not an acceptable method of attachment. Shirts should be of sufficient length to be tucked into the pants/skirt.
